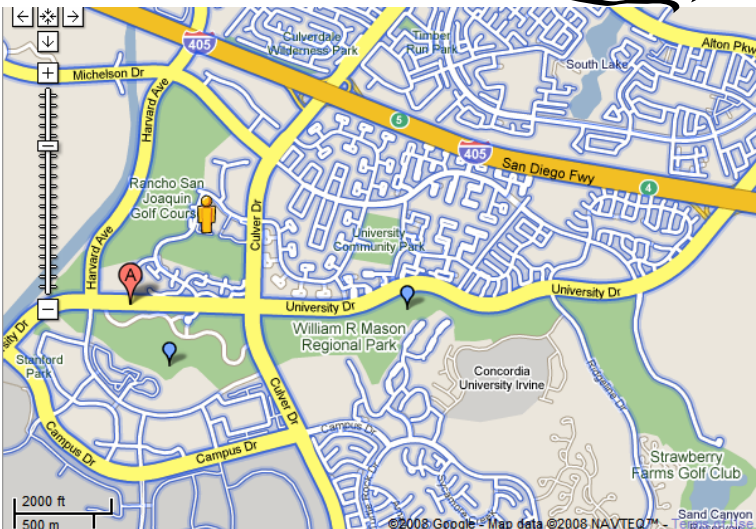

Alyson Alvarez of Covina is a third-time recipient of a CFN scholarship and the first to receive the **Eloise Heaton Memorial Scholarship**. The Heaton scholarship, started in 2009, is awarded to the student that is pursuing a teaching career and best demonstrates Eloise's dedication to the profession.

Alyson plans to obtain advanced degrees in history upon completion of her undergraduate work and pursue a teaching career.

Carson Allen Coles of El Segundo is a second year scholarship recipient. He has achieved a 3.5 GPA in Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement/English during his first year at UNL. He feels he had an extraordinary freshman year meeting his goals of getting involved in UNL school activities, getting good grades and making friends. Carson is also very involved in community service activities for the Lutheran Church on campus.

Katelynn Crum is a Nursing major from San Diego. Katelynn's goal is to be commissioned by the United States Navy as a nurse. She has been an active member in NROTC at UNL leading half of the battalion of 60 members as Alpha Company Commander. Katelynn maintained her ROTC silver stars, a reward earned for a semester GPA above 3.0. She also received the Military Order of World Wars Award for her performance as a military leader and scholastic achievements.
